

## **STAPLEHURST PARISH COUNCIL NOTES (for July 2013)**

**Staplehurst UpRockin 2013 Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> July** – Organised by the Parish Council in partnership with local groups, Staplehurst UpRockin 2013 will offer something for all the community. As well as a freestyle skating competition for Scooters 1200-1330, Skateboarders 1330-1500 and BMX riders 1500-1800 (sign up on the day) with music and judges, there will be a Boot Fair from 1000-1400 with a variety of other sides shows and refreshments from noon. Local groups may have a free boot fair pitch in return for two volunteers to assist with site organisation for two hours each. Local residents can book a boot fair pitch at £10 each. Car parking will be free on the field opposite Jubilee Playing Field.

**Staplehurst Summer Play Scheme** – Once again this summer Play Place, with financial and administrative support from the Parish Council and Maidstone Borough Council, will provide a play scheme for children aged 4-11. The scheme will run from 9.30 am to 12.30 pm on weekdays from Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> July to Friday 16<sup>th</sup> August, with an initial open morning on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> July. The venue will be the Kathie Lamb Brownie and Guide Centre at the Jubilee Field on Headcorn Road. **Bell Lane Toilets** – They are opened daily and cleaned from 7.30 a.m. and locked for the night at 7.30 p.m. The Council wishes to do all it can to keep vandalism repair costs to a minimum and would be grateful if residents could report any damage, misuse or potential vandalism problems. **Council Surgeries at the Library** – If residents wish to raise local issues representatives of the Parish Council will be at the library on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2013 between 10:00 and 12.00 noon. The surgery by Borough Councillor Richard Lusty will also be on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> July, between 10.00 am and 12.00 noon. All are welcome. The next Police session at the Library will be on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> August between 10.00 am and 11.00 am.

**Website** – As well as minutes and publicity material, reports submitted to the Parish Council are uploaded onto the website. Local businesses and village groups are welcome to manage their own website entries linked from the Trade Directory and Village Life pages of this website free of charge. Kindly contact the Parish Clerk for details. The Website Forum continues to be a useful source of local information and interesting comment.

**MBC Website Changes** – Maidstone Borough Council has revised its website. If you have saved to your 'favourites' some web pages, such as those usually mentioned in these notes, you will probably find that the addresses need updating. We have sought to identify all the new addresses and include them in these notes, but please let the Parish Office know if we have missed one!

**MBC Cleansing and Collection Services** – Call Maidstone Borough Contact Centre on 01622 602162 or go to [www.maidstone.gov.uk](http://www.maidstone.gov.uk) for information about refuse services provided by Maidstone Borough Council. Use the phone number to report any undesirable activities such as fly-tipping, dumped cars, littering etc. and help to keep the environment clean and tidy. A "pull-out" (or rear of property) collection service is available to those who are unable to wheel or carry their refuse to the front boundary of their homes.

- **Waste Freighter** – At the time of writing MBC has not finalised the Saturday freighter schedule beyond July. Check the website at <http://www.maidstone.gov.uk/residents/binsandrecycling/other-types-of-collections> for details. Please note that garden waste/vegetation is no longer accepted for disposal by the waste freighter.
- **Garden Waste** – From 28<sup>th</sup> June 2013 white garden sacks are no longer being collected by MBC, except for special cases. The sacks are now replaced by two sizes of wheelie bin (240L and 140L available for an annual hire charge of £30 and £27 respectively). Neighbours may wish to consider sharing a bin. If your property is assessed as not having room for a bin you may be eligible to obtain white sacks on a subscription basis from MBC; telephone 01622 602600 for details.
- **Food waste** – Compostable bags for the kitchen caddies are available from the Henhurst Farm Shop, Pinnock Lane, TN12 0HD and Paxman Services (UK) Ltd at Unit 3 Larkstore Park, Lodge Road, TN12 0QY.

### **REPORT INCIDENTS TO THE POLICE WITH THE NATIONAL NUMBER**

**101** All non-emergency crime-incident reports should be telephoned to 101. This non-emergency 24/7 national police telephone number will enable you access to the local policing team – wherever you happen to be in the UK. Use 101 to report any non-life threatening incident that you witness for automatic referral to the correct local policing team. Full details are available at <http://www.police.uk/101> If you prefer, calls to Crimestoppers will remain anonymous: 0800 555 111, but these may not be referred back directly to this parish or logged into the police systems. Life-threatening incidents, crimes in progress or serious injury road traffic accident that require urgent police attendance should be notified by dialling 999 in the usual way.

**Hire of North & South Hall, Staplehurst Village Centre** - To enquire about the availability of either hall, please contact the booking clerk on 07864 547453. The Parish Office does not deal with Village Centre bookings, although we do get many enquiries!

**Dog Mess & Disposal** – Red dog waste bins are provided by Maidstone Borough Council at strategic points around the parish. Thankfully only a small minority allow their dogs to defecate in public areas without clearing up the mess. If you witness such anti-social behaviour or wish to report persistent incidents of mess, telephone MBC Environmental Services on 01622 602202 to give details, including information in confidence about perpetrators if known. Visits to problem areas can be timed to be most effective and a fine imposed when the offender is caught. To report a stray dog, telephone MBC's Dog Warden on 01622 602117.

**Maidstone Borough Highway-related services** - MBC remains responsible for some highway services such as street sweeping, street nameplates, street naming and numbering, park and ride facilities. Telephone MBC Contact Centre on 01622 602162 to report most highway-related issues requiring attention. For all other Highways and Public Transport issues contact Kent Highways.

**Kent Highways** - Call 0300 333 5539 any time 24 hours a day 7 days a week to report any local highways issues, such as defects to the roads, footways, signs, drainage and street furniture, etc. You can also report defects online at <http://www.kent.gov.uk/KCC.KHSFaultsGIS.Web.Sites.Public/> . You do not need

to contact the Parish Office to report such defects. Responsibility for motorways and trunk roads lies with the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 or e-mail [ha\\_info@highways.gsi.gov.uk](mailto:ha_info@highways.gsi.gov.uk).

**Bogus Caller Advice:** If any caller does not have an appointment, then ask them to wait while you check their identity. Do not be afraid to close the door and make them wait. Checking identity can sometimes be difficult and confusing to do. If so, ask them to come back at another time when you can have someone with you. If the caller is genuine they will understand and not mind returning. The local policing team in partnership with Trading Standards has introduced a **Cold Calling Control Zone** for Staplehurst. Information has been circulated and signs put up to educate residents and cold-callers about this initiative.

**Neighbourhood Watch** operates a scheme called Nominated Neighbour, which asks the caller to go to a neighbour who will return with them, so you do not have to deal with this alone. If you wish to learn any more about this, contact the Neighbourhood Watch Office on 01622 604395. Never give any personal details to a stranger. Remember it is your home and you should not be afraid to ask them to leave. If you are at all concerned about a caller, telephone 101.

**Age UK Maidstone:** Maidstone Age UK provides information and advice to support older people, their relatives and carers. Visits can be arranged and telephone advice given – call Angela on 01622 753618. It also provides an advocacy service to become the voice of those unable to handle matters on their own – call Aileen on 01622 753618. There is a drop-in service on the first Tuesday of every month at the McCabe Centre from 10.00 am until 1.00 pm.

**Brighter Futures** – Voluntary Action Maidstone's Brighter Futures project is designed specifically for the over 65s and focuses on health and wellbeing. It organises activities such as exercise classes, day trips, shopping trips and a befriending service.
